Nursery

This week Nursery children have really enjoyed exploring shape. They have named shapes, made pictures and patterns with them and fed them to shape monsters. Please look out for different shapes when you are out and about with your child. Ask them to name them and count them. Next week we will be reading 'Owl Babies'. We will be thinking about our feelings and how we share them. Nursery children have also started going to our Computer Room on Mondays and continue to visit the Forest Garden. We will be starting to upload pictures and observations of your children to Tapestry. Please make sure you have the App and have activated your account. Reception

This week we have been using our imaginations. We have been learning about story settings and characters and have made up our own stories about what could be behind different magical doors! We have been learning about measuring time through looking at our daily routines and comparing what is the same and different about each other's routines, as well as midweek and weekend. We have also been using a variety of timers to see how quickly we can fill pots with buttons and other objects, using our hands or large tweezers!

Year 1

Year 1 had a brilliant Computing Workshop this week, where they were able to make a collage using a photo editing programme. In Art, the children are developing their pencil control and will finish an optical illusion Art piece next week. In Maths, we are developing our counting and beginning to write and solve simple calculations. Don't forget, we are going to the Institute of Physics on Monday. The children will need a coat in case it rains.

Year 2

This week in Year 2, we have started to create stories inspired by 'Journey'. The children have drawn a story map and thought about speech, descriptions and actions they are going to use when it comes to writing. In Maths, we have been learning how to use the inverse of + and - to check our calculations. Thank you to the parents who came to Covent Garden's planting session on Thursday, the children really enjoyed spending this time with you!

Year 3/4

It has been a busy week in Year 3 and 4! Liverpool Street went to Islington to attend a Computing Workshop on stopmotion animation. Stratford and Crouch Hill will attend this workshop next month. Also, thirty children from across the Year groups went to the Primary Proms on Thursday and had a wonderful time. Next month, there will be an opportunity for another group of children to attend a theatre performance as we strive to offer different cultural opportunities for the children. We have also been busy completing our module on place value in Maths, before moving on to addition next week. In Literacy, we have been using expanded noun phrases and conjunctions. In RE, we have been discussing parables and in Topic, we have been learning about Roman Gods.

Year 5 have been being very persuasive this week, writing advice to Romeo about how he should approach the problem of being banished as a newlywed. In Maths, we our looking at addition and subtraction, using our knowledge of rounding and place value to check and estimate our answers, and also to make sure all the numbers are lined up in the correct place value columns! Year 6

Year 6 have been writing letters this week, in the style of a character from the book 'Friend or Foe.' They have had to imagine what it would have felt like as evacuees during World War II. In Maths, we have been building our confidence with different methods to work out multiplication questions. Thank you to all the parents who attended parent meetings this week.
