Nursery/Reception

This week we have been reading The Gingerbread Man. We made the batter and after we put him in the oven, he ran away! We have been looking for him everywhere and the children have been making posters and letters in the hopes of him coming back. He did, and we decided not to eat him, but made our own. In Maths, we have been focusing on numbers 6, 7 and 8, and learning to use Mathematical vocabulary with addition.

Year 1

After being so familiar with the story of Rapunzel, we decided to create a twist to the story! We have created our own version of Rapunzel, by introducing different characters and settings. We have also been learning about British money, where we can identify the value of the coins and notes and even count how much money there is. In R.E., we have been looking at how Chinese New Year is celebrated, children were very excited as they watched a lion dance performance and a dragon dance performance, so they made their own dragon. In Art, we made crowns, pretending to be kings and queens. We will be going to the Park Theatre next Friday and the children are very excited!

Year 2

What a great week of challenge in Year 2! In Maths, we have been learning about inverse operations between division and multiplication. We have learnt how to divide by sharing and grouping. In Literacy, we have been writing setting descriptions, using powerful adjectives, similes and alliteration. We have been learning lots more in our P.E., Science, PSHE, Topic and R.E. lessons. We wonder what your children enjoyed the most!

Year 3/4

Year 3 and 4 had a wonderful time this week at the British Film Institute completing a workshop about using film in Literacy. Their behaviour was superb and they really enjoyed analysing many different types of films, some of which were over 80 years old! In class this week, we have been focussing on multiplication in Maths, planning a newspaper report in Literacy and learning about volcanoes and earthquakes in Topic. In R.E., we have been learning about Hinduism and in PSHCE we have been learning about fair trade.

Year 5

This week in Year 5, we have been preparing for our trips to the Museum of London by researching Ango-Saxon food and daily life. We have been using our research to begin writing our own non-chronological reports in Literacy. In Maths, we have been comparing and ordering fractions and in Science, we have been investigating the effect of filtering on soluble and insoluble materials.

Year 6

This week Year 6 have been studying Geometry in Maths. We have investigated angles in triangles and applied problem solving skills to questions about angles. In Literacy, we have started a new unit of setting descriptions - we will be describing settings in the future affected by climate change.
