#### **Nursery/Reception**

This week Kings Cross and Highbury & Islington have been reading Jack and the Beanstalk and making our very own beanstalks. We have been learning to retell the story using props, as well as becoming the characters. In Maths, we have been learning different ways of making numbers all the way to 10. Highbury & Islington Class had their Parent Workshop this week. Thank you so much for coming. Kings Cross will have theirs next week and we look forward to welcoming you to our garden.

#### Year 1

Following on from Rapunzel, this week Victoria have been reading Cinderella and Cinderelephant, while learning new vocabulary. We have learnt to compare between the fairy tales, by identifying what are the similarities and differences between the stories. In Maths, we consolidated our addition and subtraction knowledge and have learnt how to use bar models to represent addition. We have also continued looking at castles, by identifying and labelling parts of the castle and created a piece of artwork inspired by Paul Klee's 'Castle and Sun'. They did an amazing job!

#### Year 2

In Year 2 this week, we have been working hard to describe our own planet setting, ask your child about their planet; what would you see, hear, smell and feel if you travelled there? In Maths, we have been learning to divide by grouping; it has taken a little bit of practise to move away from sharing, but we have seen a lot of progress in the children's understanding, well done! In P4C (Philosophy for Children), we have been exploring the idea of 'naughty'; we have questioned what it means to us, what it might look like and if it is a helpful word to use to describe a choice or person or is there a more helpful term? It has sparked some thoughtful debate!

#### Year 3/4

In Maths this week, Year 3 and 4 have been learning about formal methods of multiplying and dividing. In Literacy, we wrote a newspaper report about the eruption of Mt Vesuvius in 79 AD and in Geography, we designed an earthquake warning poster and created our own volcano out of paper mache. In Science, we have been analysing changes of state and in RE we have been studying beliefs in Hinduism. Crouch Hill will have their Assembly at 9:10am next week, so we look forward to seeing parents and carers there.

#### Year 5

Well done to our amazing Year 5 Debaters who won both their rounds at the competition this week. We have also had a great time visiting the Museum of London to learn about the Anglo Saxons and Vikings. Why not test us on our knowledge, using our knowledge organisers?

#### Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been planning their writing for a setting description set in the future. We have also continued our learning about how to calculate missing angles in shapes. Well done to all of the children for making a huge effort with their reading diaries and Accelerated Reader guizzes - keep it up!
